RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KELLER, TEXAS, AFFIRMING CONSTITUTIONAL SUPREMACY, AMERICAN SOVEREIGNTY, AND REJECTION OF FOREIGN LEGAL SYSTEMS.

- WHEREAS, the City of Keller, Texas exists under the authority of the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Texas, which establish the lawful framework for governance, justice, and civil order within the City; and
- WHEREAS, the Constitution of the United States is the supreme law of the land and guarantees equal protection, due process, representative government, and individual liberty; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council affirms the importance of American sovereignty and constitutional self-government; and
- WHEREAS, no foreign law, religious law, or external system of governance has legal authority or standing within the jurisdiction of the City of Keller, Texas; and
- WHEREAS, sharia law, sharia courts, and any other foreign legal systems are not recognized, authorized, or permitted to operate as civil or judicial authority within the City of Keller, Texas; and
- WHEREAS, all legal matters within the City are governed exclusively by the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the State of Texas, and duly enacted federal, state, and municipal law; and
- WHEREAS, this Resolution affirms the First Amendment rights of all individuals to freedom of religion, belief, expression, and peaceful worship, while clarifying that religious belief does not confer authority to establish competing legal systems or supersede civil law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KELLER, TEXAS:

- Section 1: THAT The City Council affirms its commitment to constitutional governance and the rule of law as established by the United States Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Texas.
- Section 2: THAT, the City of Keller, Texas rejects and shall not recognize sharia law, sharia courts, or any foreign legal system as a source of civil authority, adjudication, or municipal governance.

Section 3:	THAT, this Resolution is declaratory in nature and does not create new law, regulation, or enforcement authority.
