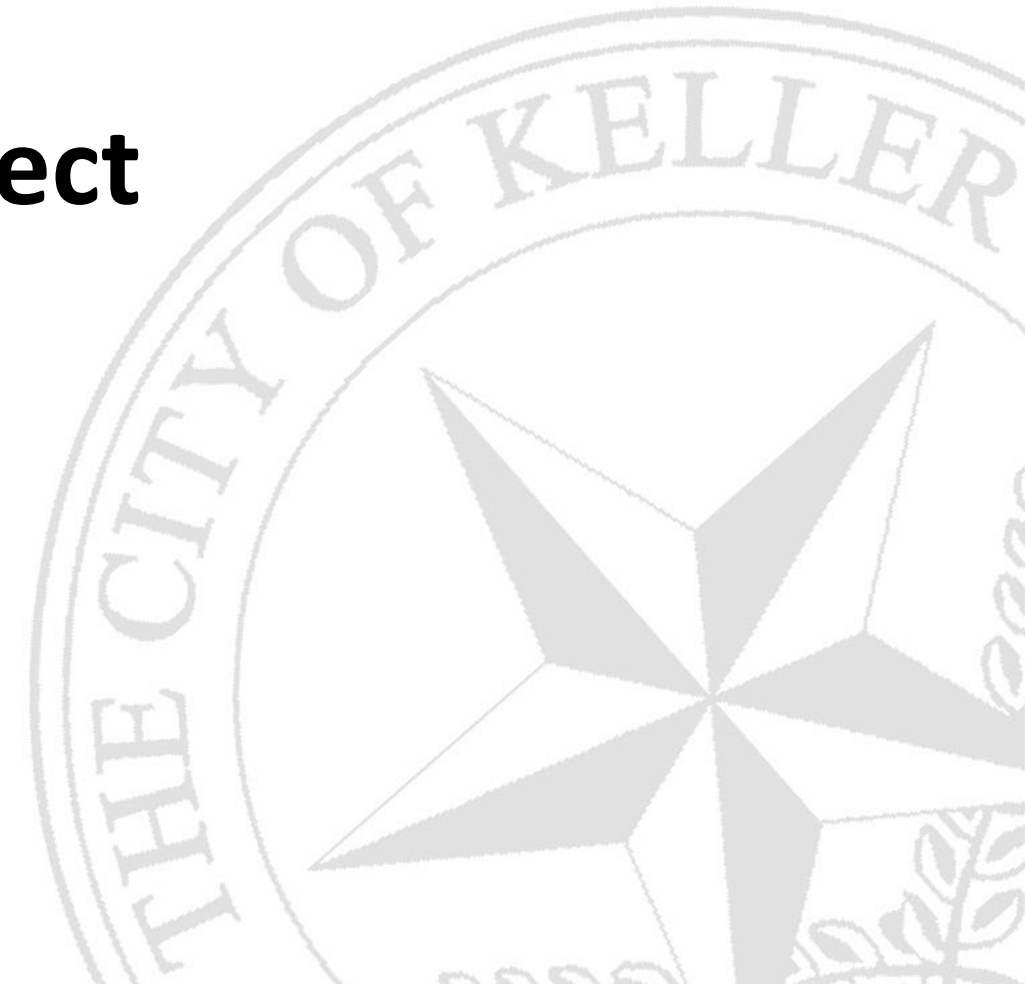

- Wall Mural (collaboration with Public Arts Board)
- Thermoplastic coating for path
- Seating areas (re-purposed boulders, benches)
- Boulder with “Stone Soup” quote (tribute to former Library Director Lisa Harper Wood)
- Ornamental greenery
