B. MINUTES CONSENT

1. **Minutes Consent-** Rick Peters moved to approve the minutes of the Keller Library Board meeting from April 6, 2026 as written. Judy Sether seconded the motion. It was passed.

C. NEW BUSINESS

1. **Friends of the Library Report-** Meeting was April 16th. Ann Flourney proposed \$7500 for Summer Reading Program prizes as well as \$2900 to purchase books for the Keller Pointe Summer Camps. Both were approved. The Bookstore is now accepting 4 banker boxes of donations, which is up from their previous limit of 2 per person. Next meeting will be May 21st at 6:30 p.m. at Café Medi. The Library Board is invited to attend.
2. **May Calendar & Events Review-** Library will be closed on Monday, May 25th in observance of Memorial Day.
3. **April 2026 Library Usage Statistics-** The Users & Experiential Engagement numbers are incorrect due to the door counters not functioning properly. The Database Usage numbers are also incorrect due to a vendors late reporting. Karen Hibbs inquired about the Locker Usage. April saw 519 items checked out through the Lockers. It continues to be a popular option.

D. DISCUSSION

1. **Meeting Room Mural Project Update-** Project partnership with Hudson Foundation & Keller Public Arts Board. Anya Bosworth, a local Keller artist, has finished her work. The mural was inspired by Bear Creek featuring local flora & fauna. There is supply issues with the wooden wainscoting to complete the project. Unsure of final install date. Anticipating an Artist Reception and official unveiling at the end of July.
2. **Maker Station Project Updates-** To date there have been 31 users for the Maker Station. The 3D Printer is the most popular with three times more usage than the other machines. KPL is discussing holding another Showcase or possible classes with the new machines to allow for demonstrations and hands on patron learning.
