
The City Manager's Office consists of the City Manager, Director of Administrative Services, Administrative Services Manager, Communications division and the Keller Town Hall Receptionist.


The purpose of the department is to maintain and enhance the partnership among citizens, elected officials and city employees through efficient and effective management of public services.


