3. Library Employee Update:

a. Keller Library received Texas Municipal Library Association's Achievement of Excellence in Libraries for the 12th year in a row. Keller Library is one of only 59 libraries out of 561 total in Texas to receive this award. This is in part due to the community & award winning staff.
