

PROCLAMATION

City of Keller

- WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and*
- WHEREAS, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska, and is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and*
- WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, reduce heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife; and*
- WHEREAS, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, beautify our community, and are a resource of joy and spiritual renewal; and*
- WHEREAS, the City of Keller has been recognized as a Tree City USA from the National Arbor Day Foundation for the 29th consecutive year and desires to continue its tree-planting ways.*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Armin R. Mizani, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Keller, Texas, and on behalf of our City Council, do hereby proclaim

Friday, November 4, 2022

As

“Texas Arbor Day”

in the City of Keller and urge all citizens, businesses, civic groups, government agencies, and other organizations to care for our trees and woodlands, and support our city’s community forestry program; and

FURTHER, encourage all citizens to nurture all trees to promote a future filled with trees; and

FURTHER, I urge all citizens to plant trees to gladden the hearts and promote the well-being of present and future generations.
