[Consider a resolution approving a Final Plat with one variance for the Cameron-SQRL Sanford Addition, a proposed residential subdivision with seven single-family lots, on 7.22 acres, located approximately 900 feet northwest of the Indian Knoll Trail and Shady Grove Road intersection, legally described as Tracts 1F and 1A02C, Abstract 1209 of the Thomas Peck Survey, zoned Single-Family 36,000 minimum square-foot lots \(SF-36\), and addressed 8660 Clara Lane and 8733 Indian Knoll Trail. Mr. Roger Miller, 8635 Clara Lane, expressed his concerns with the proposal.

A motion was made by Council Member Chris Whatley, seconded by Council Member Karen Brennan, to approve Resolution No. 5037 approving a Final Plat with one variance for the Cameron-SQRL Sanford Addition, a proposed

residential subdivision with seven single-family lots, on 7.22 acres, located approximately 900 feet northwest of the Indian Knoll Trail and Shady Grove Road intersection, legally described as Tracts 1F and 1A02C, Abstract 1209 of the Thomas Peck Survey, zoned Single-Family 36,000 minimum square-foot lots (SF-36), and addressed 8660 Clara Lane and 8733 Indian Knoll Trail, with the variance that the lot depth for Lot 1 shall be 160' in lieu of the 200' lot depth minimum in the SF-36 Zoning District. The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

2. [PUBLIC HEARING: Consider an ordinance approving a Specific Use Permit \(SUP\), for a 1,276 square-foot accessory structure, on 1.12 acres, located on the west side of North Pearson, approximately 2200 feet northwest from the intersection of Keller Parkway and North Pearson Lane, legally described as Lot 1, Block A of the Gary Cromwell Addition, zoned Single-Family 36,000 square-foot lot size or greater \(SF-36\) and addressed 516 N Pearson Lane. Isaac Wright, Applicant. Phillip Goodrum, Owner. \(SUP-2512-0052\)](#)

Mayor Mizani opened the public hearing. No public comments were received.

A motion was made by Mayor Armin Mizani, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Ross McMullin, to close the public hearing. The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

A motion was made by Council Member Chris Whatley, seconded by Council Member Shannon Dubberly, to approve Ordinance No. 2268 approving a Specific Use Permit (SUP), for a 1,276 square-foot accessory structure, on 1.12 acres, located on the west side of North Pearson, approximately 2200 feet northwest from the intersection of Keller Parkway and North Pearson Lane, legally described as Lot 1, Block A of the Gary Cromwell Addition, zoned Single-Family 36,000 square-foot lot size or greater (SF-36) and addressed 516 N Pearson Lane, with the following conditions:

1. A Specific Use Permit for an accessory structure in excess of 1,200 square-feet in the SF-36 zoning district shall be allowed.
2. A Specific Use Permit for maximum height of the accessory structure to exceed an average of 15 feet shall be allowed.

The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

3. [Consider a resolution approving a variance request related to maximum main building lot coverage for one lot in the Mays & Sweet Addition, on the property legally described as Lot 19, Block 4 of the Mays & Sweet Addition, being approximately 0.13-acres, located on the west side of College Street, approximately 600 feet south from the intersection of Keller Parkway and College Street, zoned Single-Family 8,400 square-foot lots or greater \(SF-8.4\), and addressed as 138 College Street. Frank Atherton, Applicant. Keller Main Street Depot LLC, Owner. \(UDC-2601-0001\)](#)

A motion was made by Council Member Chris Whatley, seconded by Council Member Karen Brennan, to approve Resolution No. 5038 approving a variance request related to maximum main building lot coverage for one lot in the Mays & Sweet Addition, on the property legally described as Lot 19, Block 4 of the Mays &

Sweet Addition, being approximately 0.13-acres, located on the west side of College Street, approximately 600 feet south from the intersection of Keller Parkway and College Street, zoned Single-Family 8,400 square-foot lots or greater (SF-8.4), and addressed as 138 College Street. The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

4. [Consider a resolution approving a variance to the City of Keller Unified Development Code, Article 8, Zoning Districts, Section 8.19 - Old Town Keller \(OTK\), one monument sign for an existing 1,260 square-foot medical office on 0.17 acres located on the south side of Taylor Street, approximately 85 feet southeast from the Taylor Street and South Main Street intersection, legally described as Lot 2A, Block 11 of Keller, City Addition, zoned Old Town Keller \(OTK\) and addressed 110 E. Taylor Street. Cary Stillwell, Applicant. JS20 Investments LLC., Owner. \(UDC-2507-0010\)](#)

A motion was made by Council Member Shannon Dubberly, seconded by Council Member Gregory Will, to deny the requested variance for 110 E. Taylor Street. The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

5. [Consider a resolution approving a Site Plan with variances for a proposed 5,528 square-foot multitenant building, on the property legally described as Lot 8 of the Benson Subdivision - Keller, being 0.49-acres, located on the southeast corner of the Keller Parkway and College Street intersection, zoned Retail \(R\) and addressed as 404 Keller Parkway. Andrea Petty, Franz Architects, Applicant. HGCD Land Holdings, LLC, Owner. \(SITE-2510-0016\)](#)

A motion was made by Council Member Shannon Dubberly, seconded by Council Member Gregory Will, to approve Resolution No. 5039 approving a Site Plan with variances for a proposed 5,528 square-foot multitenant building, on the property legally described as Lot 8 of the Benson Subdivision - Keller, being 0.49-acres, located on the southeast corner of the Keller Parkway and College Street intersection, zoned Retail (R) and addressed as 404 Keller Parkway with the following variances:

1. A variance to provide a 15' landscape buffer along the north property line adjacent to Keller Parkway in lieu of the 30' buffer requirement.
2. A variance to provide a 10' landscape buffer along the west property line adjacent to College Street in lieu of the 15' buffer requirement.
3. A variance to provide a 10' landscape buffer along the south property line adjacent to a single-family neighborhood in lieu of the 30' buffer requirement.
4. A variance to provide no landscape buffer along the east property line.
5. A variance to not install all required foundation planting.
6. A variance to not provide a landscaped island at the east end of the parking aisles and to allow the parking aisle facing the building to not be interrupted by a

landscaped island.

The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

6. [Consider a resolution calling a Special Election to fill the unexpired term for City Council Place 4 for the City of Keller, to be held on May 2, 2026, as set forth by the City Charter and Texas Election Code.](#)

A motion was made by Mayor Armin Mizani, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Ross McMullin, to approve Resolution No. 5040 calling a Special Election to fill the unexpired term for City Council Place 4 for the City of Keller, to be held on May 2, 2026. The motion carried unanimously (6-0).
