A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF KELLER, TEXAS, CANVASSING THE GENERAL ELECTION DULY HELD IN THE CITY OF KELLER, TEXAS, ON THE 2ND DAY OF MAY 2026, TO FILL THE THREE (3) YEAR TERMS FOR MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL PLACE 5 AND CITY COUNCIL PLACE 6.

WHEREAS, a General Election was duly held in the City of Keller, Texas, on the 2nd day of May 2026, to elect a Mayor and Council Members to fill the three (3) year terms for Mayor, Place 5 and Place 6; and
