FINDINGS – VARIANCE

Inquiry

Is the request for a variance owing to special condition inherent in the property itself?

If yes, CONTINUE If no, STOP

Is the condition one unique to the property requesting the variance?

If yes, CONTINUE If no, STOP

Is the condition self-imposed or self-created?

If yes, STOP If no, PROCEED

Will a literal enforcement of the zoning ordinance result in an unnecessary hardship?

If yes, CONTINUE If no, STOP

Will the hardship prevent any reasonable use whatsoever?

If yes, CONTINUE
If no STOP

Would the grant of the variance be contrary to public interest?

If yes, STOP If no, CONTINUE

Is the request within the spirit of the ordinance; does it further substantiate justice?

If yes, CONTINUE If no STOP

Finding

The property is/has ... (e.g., odd-shaped, unusual topo, etc.)

The condition is unique to this property.

The condition necessitating the request was not created by the property owner.

Strict enforcement of the zoning ordinance would impose a hardship above that suffered by the general public.

Without the grant of the requested variance, the property owner would be deprived of the right to use his property. Financial considerations alone cannot satisfy this requirement.
