

What this IS

- License plate recognition
- Gathers objective evidence and facts about vehicles, not people
- Alerts police of wanted vehicles
- Used to solve crime
- Adheres to all state laws


What this is NOT

- Not facial recognition
- Not tied to Personal Identifiable Information
- Not used for traffic enforcement
- Data not stored beyond 30 days
 → automatically deletes every 30 days

How does this technology prevent and eliminate crime?

- Proactive: Real time Alerts when stolen or wanted vehicles enter your city
- Investigative: As clearance rates increase, crime rates decrease
- Flock cameras serve as a **deterrent**

Protecting Privacy

- Footage owned by Agency/City and will never by sold or shared by Flock
- 30-day data retention, then deleted
- Short retention period ensures that all data not associated with a crime is automatically deleted & unrecoverable
- Takes human bias out of crime-solving by detecting objective data, and detecting events that are objectively illegal (ex. stolen vehicles)

- All data is stored securely in the AWS Cloud, with end-to-end encryption of all data
- Search reason is required for audit trail
- NOT facial recognition software
- NOT predictive policing
- NO PII is contained in Flock
- NOT used for traffic enforcement
- Not connected to registration data or 3rd party databases (Carfax, DMV)
- Transparency Portal (optional)

Case Study - Sugar Land Shooting

- Sugarland PD Sugarland, TX
- → A license plate recognition camera helped confirm the identity of the man charged with killing Alief ISD teacher Wendy Duan, Sugar Land police said.
- → SLPD said the Flock camera was used to confirm that Charvas Thompson, from Houston, was at Duan's home after witnesses identified him as her killer.
- → Thompson, 26, was arrested in Louisiana a few days later and charged with murder.
- → Sugar Land police have around 100 of these Flock license plate readers throughout the city and they plan to add 100 more.



"We just had the vehicle description,"

Sugar Land Police Assistant Chief Michelle Allen said.

"If we have a vehicle description, then we can go into the system, we can input that vehicle description and it will actually search for the reads that corresponds to those kind of vehicles."

Cross-State Silver Alert



Argyle PD I Argyle, TX

- → July 18, 2023 Officers received an alert from their Flock Safety LPRs that a vehicle associated with a missing person from Louisiana had been detected.
- → Officers located the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop.
- → The senior citizen was disoriented and believed that he was just down the street from his home.
- → Officers took him to the hospital and notified his family.

Case Study - Smash and Grab Robbery

San Bruno PD - San Bruno, CA

- → January 2022 Five suspects attempt a smash and grab at a jewelry store, but are chased off by the owner
- → But here's what didn't make the news...
- → Suspect vehicle identified using Flock
- → SBPD thought the suspects would try again, potentially more violently
- → Vehicle placed on a custom hotlist
- → SBPD receives a real-time alert that the suspects are returning
- → Officers locate the vehicle within seconds, preventing another attempt



- Amy Sinnwell left her home on July 21, 2023 at 2:35 p.m.
- Subject stated she was going to Target and had not been seen since.
- Last communication was by text on July 22, 2023 at 7:21 p.m.
- Subject texted that she wanted to be left alone.
- Subject was believed to be driving a silver 2017 Ford Expedition, TX LP XXXXXXX.
- Subject's phone pinged in Hugo, OK at approximately 1 p.m. on July 24, 2023.
- ALPR Notifications: Paris PD, Rowlett PD, and Fort Worth PD





Press Release: July 26, 2023



- Keller Police were able to make contact this morning with Amy Lea Sinnwell, who was reported missing on Monday, July 24.
- Ms. Sinnwell is safe and is being removed from the missing person database.
- Keller investigators have been tracking Ms. Sinnwell's movements throughout this investigation, and have been working with local, state and federal partners to find Ms. Sinnwell to ensure she is safe.
- At no time during our investigation did the facts or evidence of the case indicate foul play, and we will continue to respect the privacy of Ms. Sinnwell by not sharing additional details at this time.
