- Donate scholarships to Gold Star kids
- Build monuments to honor them.
- Woody's Goal: Monuments in all **50 states** 
  - -43 completed (39 states)
  - 45 in progress

## **Overall Design Features**

- 2 sides, 4 panels, black granite
- Cut out represents the loved one who paid the ultimate sacrifice
- Explanation marker
- Local committee is responsible for choosing the images on the monument and plaza design

- Tells a story: Homeland, Family, Patriot, and Sacrifice.
- Reflection of the local community, it's Gold Star Families and their fallen heroes.






# Monument Plaza 25' to 30' wide or circle diameter



## Keller Gold Star Family Monument

- Components
  - Monument
  - "Soldier's Cross" (boots/rifle/helmet)
     to honor the fallen
  - U.S. and Texas flags
  - Bench/retaining wall
  - Engraved bricks/pavers
- Soldier's cross viewed through cutout in monument
- Overlooking lake
- Lighted for night viewing



### **Proposed Location**



- Both sides are visible
- Near electrical access
- Along walking trails
- Unlikely that future expansion projects will be affected.
- Brick and construction would compliment City Hall
- Quiet and peaceful for reflection
- Potential location for Memorial Day ceremonies


View from the

# **Proposed Timeline**

## Maintenance

- Minimal other than periodic cleaning: soap/water
- Other replacement costs: flags, light bulbs
- Request to city: assume maintenance requirements after monument completion
- In all past monuments, entities associated with the site (city, state, private entity) have assumed the costs and responsibility for maintenance
- If city doesn't assume maintenance responsibility, foundation recommends additional funds be raised and placed into a maintenance account.
- Bottom line: this is essentially a gift to the city

#### Cost

#### Section A: The Monument


- Granite pieces, explanation marker
- Approx. \$45,000 (with no in-kind donations)


#### Section B: The Plaza

- Concrete footer and foundation
- Surrounding plaza (concrete pad, pavers, etc...)
- Landscaping
- Electrical and Lighting
- Other add-ons: (flag poles, benches/seating)
- Additional Components ("Soldier's Cross")
- Cost varies, but approx. \$15,000
- Total Estimated Cost: \$60,000

## **Fundraising Plans**

- Sell engraved pavers, bricks
- Tables at annual Crawfish Krawl and other city events
- Presentations to Chamber of Commerce, etc...
- In-kind donations
- Letter and e-mail campaign
  - Local Businesses
  - Keller citizens
- Sell monument stuff (coins, lapel pins, etc...)
- Social media campaign and web site
- Media campaign (CBS 11)
