



Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

Research & Community Survey

Background

- There is currently one electric vehicle charging station within the Keller city limits, in the Kohl's parking lot
- Electric Vehicle Charging Stations, even on private property, are not currently addressed in our Unified Development Code
- Early City Council discussions about Old Town Keller West had included an interest in seeing electric vehicle charging options within the project footprint
- Community Development was recently contacted by a Keller Town Center business regarding a request for an EVCS in Town Center
- Vehicle charging has become more commonplace in our neighboring communities, prompting inquiries from residents





Background

- The city partnered with KCAL to offer an internship to conduct a community survey and perform research regarding electric vehicle charging stations.
- In January 2018, Keller High School senior and law-track KCAL student Fernando Avalos-Oviedo joined the city as an intern. The EVCS Research Project and Community Survey served to support his educational goals by exposing him to municipal research and law, while simultaneously providing the city with valuable insight.

Level 3 Charging

Public EV Charging Stations are either "Level 2" or "Level 3" chargers. Level 3 stations charger faster than Level 2. In both cases, the user pays for their own charging. (Level 1 charging is considered the most basic of residential setups.)




Most cities allow EV charging stations through a standard building or electrical permit process. Southlake requires an SUP.

Do you *plan to purchase* an electric vehicle or plug-in hybrid in the next five years?




Community Survey Results

> 32% 29% 13% 15%


How supportive would you be of the city *allowing private investors* to fund EVCS on public property?
