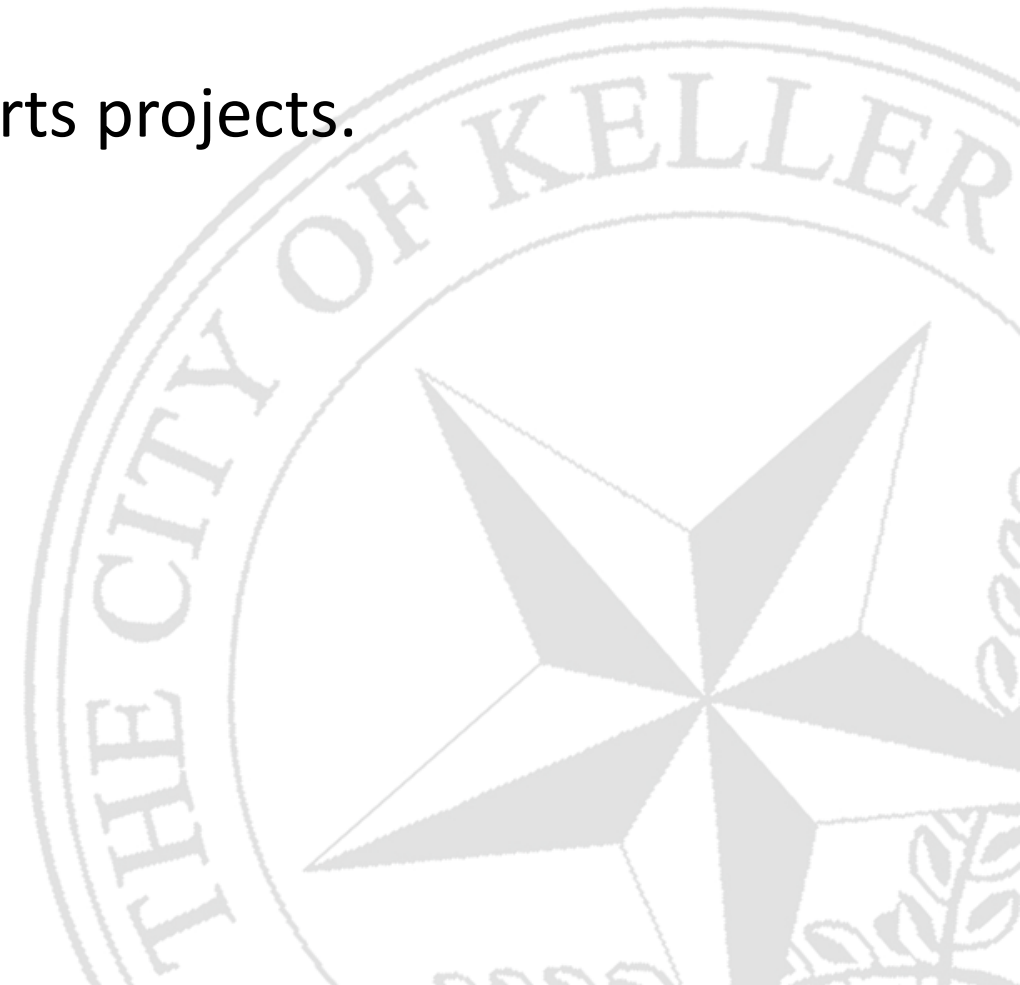

Item D-1

Public Arts Development Fee Update

- Fee was adopted by City Council in October 2015 as a new method for funding public art acquisition, installation and/or administration
- Equivalent to 0.25% of construction value, the fee applies to:
 - All new commercial/industrial developments
 - Residential developments of 5 lots or more
 - Redevelopments of non-residential or mixed use projects where the floor area is increased by 25% or more

Item D-1 Animal Services Sculpture



- Artist agreement approved by City Council in Feb. 2019 for \$40,000
- Architect hired in 2019 for \$15,000 to work with staff and artist to design sculpture plaza and update electrical components around existing monument sign and flag poles
- Architect's estimate for plaza and electrical work: \$60,000

Item D-1

Animal Services Sculpture

- Nov. 2019: Bid opening; lowest bid is more than double architect's estimate
- Next steps:
 - City Council rejection of all bids at March 3 meeting
 - Architect revising design and significantly reducing amount of concrete
 - Re-bid project: late spring
