D. WORK SESSION

1. Old Town Keller Phase II Update

Administrative Services Manager Sarah Hensley introduced Ms. Sam Delmotte, Kimley Horn, who gave a presentation relating to the Old Town Keller Phase II project. Ms. Delmotte discussed the project status and timeline and introduced the addition of a median on Main Street that is proposed to be installed between Olive and Vine Street. She also introduced Ms. Kaley Wilson, Kimley Horn, who is part of the consultant team working on the project.

Discussion was held by the City Council regarding local businesses impacted by the project, the pedestrian hybrid beacon proposed for just south of the Bates Street and Main Street intersection, traffic, proposed improvements for the Main Street and Vine Street intersection, and project costs. Mayor McGrail expressed his disappointment that a full traffic signal will not be installed on Main Street.

The City Council directed City staff to continue forward with the project design to include the Main Street median.
