## A. CALL TO ORDER - Mayor Pat McGrail

Mayor Pat McGrail called the Pre-Council Meeting to order at 5:04 P.M.

The City Council discussed and reviewed the agenda items.

### C. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Work Session was held before the Executive Session.

### D. WORK SESSION

1. <u>Discuss the request by the Mayor to consider amending the Keller Unified Development</u> <u>Code to change the requirements for carports.</u>

Director of Community Development Julie Smith gave a presentation relating to potential changes to the Unified Development Code regarding carport requirements. A comparison of other Cities' carport requirements, Keller's current code, and Specific Use Permit restrictions were discussed by the City Council. The City Council directed staff to continue to do research prior to placing the topic on a future agenda for action.

2. Tarrant County Aerial Spraying Update.

City Manager Mark Hafner gave an update on the possibility of aerial spraying by Tarrant County to combat mosquito populations. Concern was expressed by Tarrant County Public Health over a surge of mosquitoes and humans testing positive for West Nile Virus. The City of Keller has had twenty-nine positive mosquito tests for West Nile Virus and two confirmed human cases in 2020. Tarrant County Public Health believes that aerial spraying is not warranted at this time based on recent temperature changes.

If aerial spraying is recommended and Keller participates, the agreement will only be for the current season and the City will provide communication to residents regarding the spraying.

Director of Administrative Services Aaron Rector gave a presentation relating to the following amendments to the General Fund: the General Government/Facilities Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) Fund, the Pointe CIP Fund, the Self Insurance Fund, the Street System CIP Fund, the Water-Wastewater Utility Fund, and the Water-Wastewater System CIP Fund.

Mayor Pat McGrail opened the public hearing. No public comments were received.

A motion was made by Council Member Chris Whatley, seconded by Council Member Tag Green, to close the public hearing. The motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Council Member Chris Whatley, seconded by Council Member Sheri Almond, to approve Ordinance No. 1983 approving certain amendments to the Fiscal Year 2019-20 Annual Operating Budget for the City of Keller, Texas, in accordance with Article VIII, Section 8.13, of the Keller City Charter. The motion carried unanimously.

 PUBLIC HEARING: Consider an ordinance adopting the annual budget for the City of Keller, Texas, for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2020 and ending September 30, 2021, including the 2020-21 Capital Improvements Program, and adopting the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Fee Schedule for the City of Keller, Texas.

Director of Administrative Services Aaron Rector gave a presentation relating adopting the annual budget for the City of Keller, Texas, for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2020 and ending September 30, 2021, including the 2020-21 Capital Improvements Program, and adopting the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Fee Schedule. Mr. Rector noted that the total FY 2020-21 Proposed Operating Budget expenditures are \$86,494,362, a decrease of \$3,979,492 or 4.4 percent from the FY 2019-20 Budget. The published Proposed Operating Budget expenditures were \$85,692,215. The increase is related to re-appropriations of \$754,147 with the financial software being \$562,152 of the re-appropriations, increased funding of \$43,000 for the Nightingale Culvert project, increased funding of \$90,000 for the Sanitary Sewer Evaluation Study project, and decreased funding of \$85,000 for the Utility Relocation project.

Mayor Pat McGrail opened the public hearing. No public comments were received.

A motion was made by Council Member Chris Whatley, seconded by Council

#### Member Tag Green, to close the public hearing. The motion carried unanimously.

Council Member Tag Green expressed gratitude to City staff for the preparation of the proposed budget. He also asked Director of Administrative Services Aaron Rector to provide more information regarding the tax rate reduction and the homestead exemption increase, and why the City has proposed both. Mr. Rector explained that Homestead Exemptions provide relief to homeowners, and tax rate reduction provides relief to both commercial and homeowners. The City strives to balance these along with maintaining current service levels. Councilman Green also asked if these reductions are sustainable without financial hardship or tax increases in the future. Mr. Rector responded that the City re-evaluates each year using conservative projections, and the proposed budget which maintains current service levels is sustainable in the City's five-year model.

Mayor Pro Tem Sean Hicks thanked Mayor Pat McGrail for his leadership throughout the budget preparation process and City staff for their hard work. He also expressed gratitude for the increases to the Public Safety salaries included in the proposed budget.

Council Member Chris Whatley congratulated and thanked City staff for work that was put into the proposed budget.

Mayor Pat McGrail thanked City staff and the City Council for the proposed budget, and made a motion to approve Ordinance No. 1984 adopting the annual budget for the City of Keller, Texas, for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2020 and ending September 30, 2021, including the 2020-21 Capital Improvements Program, and adopting the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Fee Schedule for the City of Keller, Texas. Council Member Sheri Almond seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Director of Administrative Services Aaron Rector gave a presentation relating levying taxes to be assessed on all taxable properties within the city limits of the City of Keller, Texas for the Tax Year 2020 (Fiscal Year 2020-21). The tax rate proposed in the fiscal year 2020-21 budget is \$0.39500/\$100 of taxable valuation, a reduction of \$0.0049 from the current year and is the seventh rate reduction in a row.

A motion was made by Council Member Tag Green, seconded by Council Member Mitch Holmes, to approve Ordinance No. 1985 levying taxes to be assessed on all taxable properties within the city limits of the City of Keller, Texas for the Tax Year 2020 (Fiscal Year 2020-21). The motion carried unanimously.
